CalFresh Program for Food Support (SNAP)

- Provides monthly money for food to lowincome households.

Medi-Cal (Medicaid)


- Government funded health insurance.
- Pays for doctor's visits, hospital and medicines.
- You may qualify depending on your income.
- If you had emergency Medi-Cal, return to County Human Services/Social Services with your asylum grant letter and request full scope Medi-Cal coverage.

Public Benefit Application Steps and Necessary Documents

Step One

Apply for benefits in the county where you live.

Prepare/bring:

- Receipt for SSN or card
- Photo ID
- I-94 and grant letter
- Rent/lease agreement
- Bank statements
- Vaccine records for minor children
- Car registration
- Discuss document delays with worker

Step Two

No rental contract or income?

- Write a declaration that states the address you live and how much you need to pay to contribute to costs
- Record and sign how much money you have and from what sources

Step Three

Keep the application receipt!



Recommended Health Screening Guidelines for Physicians who Serve Newly Arrived Refugee, Asylum Seeker, Asylee, and Humanitarian Parolee Populations in California

Summary

The California Department of Public Health's Office of Refugee Health provides comprehensive health screening for newly arrived refugees to California through eleven county programs. This tool provides recommended health screening guidelines which are in accordance with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommendations for the U.S. Domestic Medical Examination for Newly Arriving Refugees. These same standards are also applicable to asylees, asylum seekers, humanitarian parolees, as well as migrant populations in general.

Employment Authorization Document (EAD)

- Provides proof of work authorization for asylum seekers with cases that are pending.
- Serves as formal proof of identity.
- Individuals granted asylum are automatically authorized to work (no EAD needed).
- If you need a federally acceptable form of identity, apply for an EAD.
- Use USCIS Form I-765.
- Valid for only 2 years.
- Effective Sept 2023, new and renewal EADs will be valid for up to 5 years.





Have You Moved?

YOU <u>MUST</u> report each change of address to USCIS within <u>10 days</u> of each move with an AR-11 change of address form.

If you filed electronically for your asylum claim:

- Use your USCIS on-line account to file an AR-11 form.
- Proof of change will be generated.

If you filed a paper application for your asylum claim:

- Complete an AR-11 form and mail it to USCIS.
- Notice of receipt will be mailed.

If you are currently in refugee or asyles status, you may be able to help your relative obtain asyles or refugee status. You can start the process by filing a Form 1-730, Refugee/Asyles Relative Petition. Filing instructions and forms are available on our Web site at www.uscist.gov.

Who are the relatives for whom I may file?

If you were admitted to the United States as a refugee or were granted asylum less than 2 years ago, you may file an I-730 for thefollowing relatives:

 Unmarried children who were under age 21 at the time you were admitted as a refugee or granted asylum

An I-730 petition must be filed within 2 years of being admitted as a refugee or being granted asylum. If it has been longer than 2 years since you were admitted as a refugee or were granted asylum, you may want to get legal advice to determine if there are any other immigration benefits available to your relative.

What happens after I file for my relative?

Embassy or consulate will notify your relative when and where to appear, inviting him or her to apply for travel authorization to enter the United States.

After I file, how long will it take before my relative's

The time it takes to process and approve your relative's petition depends on a number of factors. Once you file, we will send you a receipt. You can check and monitor current processing times on our Wash airs.

If I marry after I become a refugee or asylee, can I file I-730 for my bushend or wife?

You cannot file an I-730 for your husband or wife if the marriage occurred after you become a refugee or asylee. However, you may want to get legal advice to determine if there are any other immigration benefits available to here exceeding the property of the proper

Refugee/Asylee Relative Petition USCIS Form I-730

Family Reunification

- Must file the petition within 2 years of asylum status.
- Petition for spouse and unmarried children under age 21 who live abroad.
- Family members must have been listed in your original asylum application.
- Members must have no basis for denial (such as security threat, persecution of others, criminal conviction).
- Family members qualify for benefits as derivative asylees.
- Fee to Apply: \$0.00
- Use USCIS Form I-730.
- · Processing times: variable.

Refugee Travel Document USCIS Form I-131

International Travel

- Use a Travel Document for international travel and re-entry to the U.S.
- No travel document needed for domestic travel within the United States.
- Call the consulate of the county you will visit to ask if the country accepts a U.S. Travel Document.
- Fee to apply: \$105-220 based on age, required biometrics.
- Use USCIS Form I-131.
- · Processing times: 10-13 months.
- Valid for 1 year.
- Visiting your home country may jeopardize your asylum status.

Application to Register Permanent Residence or Adjust Status to Lawful Permanent Resident (Green Card) USCIS Forms I-693 and I-485

May apply any time after being granted asylum. Must be physically present in the U.S. for 365 days before the grant of the application occurs.

USCIS Clarifies Physical Presence Guidance for Asylees and Refugees for Adjustment of Status (Green Card)

- · News Release Date
- 02/02/2023
- Effective immediately, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) has updated guidance
 in the <u>USCIS Policy Manual</u> to clarify that both asylees and refugees must have been physically
 present in the United States for one year when we adjudicate their <u>Form I-485</u>, <u>Application to</u>
 <u>Register Permanent Residence or Adjust Status</u>, rather than at the time they file their
 <u>adjustment of status application</u>. This applies to all Form I-485 and <u>Form N-400</u>, <u>Application</u>
 <u>for Naturalization</u>, applications pending on Feb. 2, 2023, and those filed on or after that date.
- This update will promote consistency across asylee and refugee adjustment of status
 applications. If we cannot determine whether an applicant satisfies the one-year physical
 presence requirement by reviewing their file or our records when we adjudicate their Form I485, we may request additional evidence.

- · Eligible for additional family reunification programs
- · Cannot be removed from the U.S.
- Save for fees
- Required to pass written and verbal exam in English language on U.S. history and government



Selective Service

- Mandatory for males aged 18-25.
- Register online at https://www.sss.gov
 or
- Register at a U.S. Post Office.
- Keep proof of registration.
- Required for government financial aid for college/university education.
- Required for citizenship application.

Follow Federal and State Laws

- Federal law governs immigration.
- Many US states have legalized medical and/or recreational marijuana.
- It is a **Federal Offense** to possess marijuana.
- Request legal representation, if needed.

Federal and State Taxes to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS)

- File your federal and state taxes in each year you earn income.
- Your employer will send you a W-2 or 1099 form each year in January.
- You may get a tax refund.
- Be aware of tax filers who charge high fees!

- You may only include dependents who live with you in the U.S. on your taxes.











The Enhanced Services for Asylees and other Vulnerable **Non-Citizens** (ESAVN) Program

Granted Asylum and Need Help to Connect to Benefits and Services in CA?

- ESAVN program provides 90 days of assistance.
- Must seek services within first year of asylum grant.
- Receive help to access public benefits and navigate new systems.
- Obtain cultural orientation, links to employment, and other key services such as health care and legal services.


