Through the Newcomers Health Program, at the Refugee Medical Clinic at
San Francisco General Hospital (995 Potrero Avenue, 5th Floor, SF)

WHY should you get a health screening?



Learn about your health status and any health conditions you may have.



Speak with doctors who have experience working with asylees, and receive in-person medical interpretation in your language.



Receive treatment, medications, and preventative healthcare.



Receive referrals to mental health specialists and support groups.



Receive immunizations that will help when you apply for a green card.



Establish your medical record here in the U.S.



Take advantage of a valuable service that is free to you.

What to do next:

Step 1: Apply for Medi-Cal health insurance or Refugee Medical Assistance. These benefits are **time-limited**. Apply today at your nearest Social Services Agency (*see back for office locations*).

Step 2: Call Newcomers Health Program to schedule a health assessment:

Step 3: If approved for Medi-Cal, you will receive a Benefits Identification Card within 45 days. Bring this card and identification to your appointment.

* Newly granted asylee, refugee, special immigrant visa status or certified victim of trafficking

Bring with you:

- I-94, or other documentation of asylum status
- Social Security Number
- Photo identification (passport)
- Proof of income, if you already are working
- Recent bank statement, if you already have a bank account
- Proof of residency, if you already have a rent receipt, or a utility bill



Please note:

Use of Medi-Cal/RMA will *not* hurt your chance of getting a green card.
